The tax increases are difficult for not only senior citizens but all residents of Kane County

County Board Chairman Lauzen thanked the Commissioners on all the good work they do for the Forest Preserve and he requested the Commissioners consider delaying the vote on the levy and to consider other avenues for revenue sources until 2016 - 17 when the bonds will be repaid, such as grants, river boat monies or reaching into the District's reserves. Try not to make things harder for the residents of Kane County by raising the property tax levy. The District and the Commissioners can buy a lot of good will by not raising the property tax levy. Thank you.

William Blatner of 1138 Barkston Lane, Aurora commented that property values are declining and many residents are trying to control expenditures. Many residents in his area cannot afford a tax increase and may have to sell their homes as they are senior citizens and live on fixed incomes. He asked the District to decrease expenditures.

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONSERVATION EASEMENT ON THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE LES ARENDS FOREST PRESERVE LOCATED IN BATAVIA TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Forest Preserve District of Kane County has the authority to purchase real estate for open space purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Forest Preserve District of Kane County authorized a contract to purchase property located immediately north and adjacent to the Les Arends Forest Preserve property located in Batavia Township (the "Property" as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto) to preserve and protect native flora, fauna, cultural resources, soils, watersheds and drainage patterns of the property, but the contract to purchase did not contain specific reference to a conservation easement; and

WHEREAS, the Seller of the Property and certain adjoining landowners desire to have Seller impose a conservation easement upon the Property (all as more particularly set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto) as a condition of making a donation of funds by an adjoining landowner to assist the Forest Preserve District to purchase the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Forest Preserve District agrees with the terms of the conservation easement for the benefit of the Property and adjoining properties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to conservation easement, a northerly 20 foot buffer area will be created in the Property, provided, however that the Forest Preserve District staff will retain the right, among other things, to enter the Property for management and maintenance, including but not limited to, planting native trees, grasses and forbs and to trim, remove, mow or burn vegetation to encourage proper growth and maintenance of native species according to the good stewardship standards of the District.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Forest Preserve District of Kane County that the Seller of the Property is approved to impose a conservation easement in the form as attached hereto as Exhibit B upon the Property as part of the conveyance the Property to the District, pursuant to the prior approved contract, and as a condition of the making of a donation by the adjacent landowner toward the purchase price of the Property under the contract.

President Hoscheit commented that the Executive Committee approved the levy as presented. The increase would be *\$.83 for the average household. Forest Preserve taxes for the average household are approximately \$195 per year.* Of that \$195, 81% or \$160 is debt service for bonds, mandated by the electorate over 4 referenda. The acquisition of Glenwood School by the District is an example of how we've been fiscally conservative. Households pay \$10 over 15 years or, if the property had been developed, residents would be paying \$100 per household in perpetuity. Eighty percent of property taxes is to pay off the District's investments and 19% is to pay for the day-to-day operations of the District. The District has added 2,000 acres, opened Creek Bend Nature Center and Big Rock Campground, and is scheduled to open the Brunner property next spring. There has been an 11% increase in the District's holdings with no increase in staffing. The 1.7% operations adjustment comes to us from the Executive Committee. The Forest Preserve has only one source of revenue, unlike the county that receives revenues from sales taxes, tickets, and court fees. County is looking for a 4-5% increase in spending when done with salaries. The \$150,000 would provide a 2% salary adjustment for our staff. There are approximately 400 volunteers that work hand in hand with staff in numerous forest preserves saving the District thousands of dollars. Raises allow us to maintain existing staff. The District's average increase in salary is less than 2%, over the years. We have been conservative and transparent in our dealings. The public has supported the District and like that their property values benefit from the acquisition of open space. In 2016, the average household will receive a roughly \$40 reduction in taxes and in 2017, another \$48 reduction per the average household. Freezing the levy will cause a decrease in services. The options available are a *River Boat Grant or the District reaching into the reserves for this additional \$150,000.*

Commissioner Frasz stated that the numbers are so close; it's virtually a flat increase. We are slowly climbing out of the recession and in 2016 and 2017 there will be a substantial reduction in the taxes. Commissioner Frasz would like to hear more about the River Boat option.

Commissioner Smith commented that \$.83 cents is not a lot of money, it is the message we are sending. People are in trouble approximately 6,800 homes went into foreclosure in Kane County last year.

Commissioner Allan asked if the farm revenues could be raised to help close the gap for the next few years, or possibly some River Boat money.

President Hoscheit responded stating that each year approximately 200 acres are removed and put back into prairie as is required by some of our grants. This would only be a temporary solution to the problem.

Commissioner Lewis stated that there were a number of issues, the fundamental issue is spending. The District could drain its savings or sell items. The District has already saved the citizens of the County money with the refinancing of the bonds. We need to look at possibly not removing property from farming this year. Commissioner Lewis stated he is comfortable with approving the levy for the District.

Commissioner Silva commented that her first duty is to listen to her constituents and hold the line on taxes. There has not been enough thought given to other avenues.

Commissioner Wojnicki stated that open space is the ultimate tax cap, as there is not the need for schools, roads or infrastructure. More people are staying home and using the preserves for picnics and outings. The opening of Creek Bend and the Big Rock Campground give residents wonderful places to visit and camp. The staff is wonderful and the preserves are well maintained.

Commissioner Donahue stated that he has listened to both sides and the arguments are equal. He represents his district and they voted in favor of the referenda's and they want open space. It is easy to be political but the increase is a very reasonable amount for the operation of the District.

Commissioner Starrett replied that she has listened to all the talk, but the number 1 thing her constituents say is do not raise taxes.

President Hoscheit commented please keep in perspective the Levy is a 1.7% increase; the District has 10% more property along with a 10% increase in maintenance on District property without additional staff.

Commissioner Pollock stated that the increase seems like a small amount with 81% going towards debt service and 19% for operations, but the public has not been given the chance to vote on the increase. Residents are saying do not increase taxes, hold the line. We must look for other solutions to hold the District over until 2016 and 2017 when the bonds are paid off.

President Hoscheit remarked that the Levy can be held over for 1 month while staff evaluates different options or approve the Levy as presented or vote the Levy down and have staff reduce the budget by the 1.7%, or table the Levy for 1 month and request from the County multiyear River Boat funds until 2016.

Commissioner Davoust commented that everyone is sensitive to the annual budget and as stewards of the District we need to look at the bigger picture. The District refinanced the bonds, saving the citizens of the County approximately \$1.5 million dollars and already have eased some of the tax burden. We now need to bridge the gap until 2016-17.

-Motion by Commissioner Kenyon, seconded by Commissioner Frasz, to table the Levy and bring it back next month and request River Boat money from the County until 2016. Commissioners voting in the affirmative: Allan, Auger, Castro, Davoust, Donahue, Ford, Frasz, Gillam, Haimann, Kenyon, Kojzarek, Lewis, Molina, Pollock, Scheflow, Silva, Smith, Taylor, Vazquez and Wojnicki. Voting in the negative: Barreiro, Laesch and Starrett; motion carried.

COMMENTS BY THE PRESIDENT: Executive Director Meyers announced the IAPD Best of the Best Awards Gala to be held September 27, 2013 at the Chevy Chase Country Club. The District will be receiving 2 awards - The Best Green Practices Award and Partnership Award with the St. Charles Park District, Illinois Department of Natural Resources and River Bend Community Group for the development of River Bend Park – formally the Illinois Youth Center in Valley View. Commissioner Wojnicki will also be receiving her 15 year service award.

REPORTS: President Hoscheit called for a motion to place the reports on file.

Motion by: Commissioner Ford, seconded by Commissioner Haimann, to place the reports on file: motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to come before the Committee, the meeting was duly adjourned on a motion by Commissioner Kenyon, seconded by Commissioner Haimann, to 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 8, 2013, at the Kane County Government Center, Geneva, Illinois.
