Learn about Bat Ecology, July 16, at Peck Farm Park

GENEVA, IL — Bats are the only mammals capable of true flight; and you can learn more about bats and their ecology during a July 16 “Learn from the Experts” nature program.

“Bats: Illinois’ Flying Mammals,” takes place Sunday, July 16, from 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. at Peck Farm Park in Geneva. The program is for ages 18 and up. Registration is \$10 per person.
