“From Glaciers to Wildflowers” program at Feb. 24 nature program

GENEVA, IL — Discover how Illinois’ living landscape came to be, during a Feb. 24 nature program with geologist, professor and author Raymond Wiggers.

Wigger’s talk will explore the origins of Illinois some 20,000 years ago, when the landscape was a foreboding ice desert. He’ll describe the changes since the last glaciation, and the evolution of the Prairie State’s landscapes, soils and plant communities into their present forms.
