Improve your nature pictures with a smartphone photography class

GENEVA, IL — Brush-up on your nature photo skills with the Forest Preserve District of Kane County’s new, smartphone photography program.

“Smart Art: Nature Photography with a Smartphone” is an outdoor class taught by professional photographer Emily Cudworth. She’ll help students “see” nature through the lens of their smartphone camera, engage with nature, and maximize their discoveries.
