Learn about Chicagoland's coyotes at Forest Preserve District program

GENEVA, IL —Discover the secrets of Illinois' largest predator at a June 16 nature program.

The program entitled “Coyotes of Chicagoland: Our Nocturnal Neighbor” will take place on Thursday, June 16 from 7 - 8:30 p.m. at the Red Oak Nature Center. Registration is \$10.

According to a study done by Ohio State University, there are over 2,000 coyotes living in “the greater Chicago area.” Cook County Wildlife Biologist Chris Anchor will present current research on these urban coyotes. He will also uncover truths and discuss some of the myths usually associated with coyotes.

This program is part of the “Learn from the Experts” series. Learn from the Experts programs are taught by experts in the field and offer in-depth information and learning opportunities.
